Dr. Cindy Asbjornsen of the Vein Healthcare Center Named a Fellow by the American College of Phlebology

November 27, 2012 (South Portland, ME) – The American College of Phlebology (ACP) recently named <u>Dr. Cindy Asbjornsen</u> a Fellow, with the designation of "FACPh."

Dr. Asbjornsen joins only 42 other ACP Fellows, including such pioneers in phlebology as Drs. Steven Elias, Helane Fronek, Robert Min, and Melvin Rosenblatt.

Fellows of the ACP are recognized for their substantial commitment and contribution to the specialty of phlebology, the medical field that is concerned with the study, diagnosis, and treatment of venous disease.

According to the ACP, commitment to phlebology is shown through publications, education, years of practice, leadership, volunteerism, and other qualities or behaviors that lead to the advancement of vein care. Fellows must be unanimously approved by the ACP Fellowship Committee and unanimously elected by the ACP Board of Directors.

Dr. Cindy Asbjornsen is the founder of the Maine Phlebology Association and the Vein Healthcare Center in Maine. Dr. Asbjornsen is certified by the American Board of Phlebology and cares for all levels of venous disease, including spider veins, varicose veins and venous stasis ulcers.
